Advice to protect homes

HOME and business owners picked up some valuable security tips at a crime prevention roadshow held at the Guildhall last weekend.

Surrey Police officers and representatives from Crimestoppers, Neighbourhood Watch and StranDNA were on hand to talk to people during the event on Friday and Saturday.

The roadshow was organised by Godalming firm Absolute Security Systems Ltd.

Surrey Police crime reduction advisor PC Steve Cake worked

alongside them, giving advice, hints and tips on how to protect homes and businesses.

Visitors also tried out some of the latest technology designed by security specialists to deter thieves and intruders.

These included property marking pens, timer switches for house lights, purse bells and lanyards which connect purses to handbags.
